

Guidance Notes on the BRITISH HORSE PASSPORT

Thank you for your interest in our British Horse Passport and we are pleased to enclose the registration forms you requested together with one or two notes which we hope will be of assistance.

Please Note: As from 1st July 2009 a passport cannot be issued unless the animal is also microchipped

The passport must be sent to the Society for the transfer at each change of ownership with the current transfer fee and returned on the death of the horse

Cheques for the initial registration fee and for transfer fees should be made payable to "The Cleveland Bay Horse Society"

A declaration as to whether the horse is or is not intended for slaughter for human consumption is included in the passport but this does not have to be completed until any of the following:- 1) the horse is exported 2) the horse is administered with a medicine which should never be administered to a food producing animal 3) the horse is consigned for human consumption.

- The Identity Chart should be completed by a vet at the time he inserts the microchip and the microchip number and location recorded on the ID chart.

- The photograph is entirely voluntary and incurs a charge of an extra £5
- If any breeding is quoted the passport will be stamped "Breeding Not Verified" unless you have proof of that breeding
- If you do not know the date of birth then put in an approximate year of foaling
- *One horse, one passport.* If the animal already has any sort of registration/identification document these, or copies must be included with the application.
