

GUIDANCE NOTES FOR COMPLETION OF PURE BRED APPLICATIONS

PLEASE HELP US TO HELP YOU

To comply with EU regulations **EVERY** horse **MUST**, by law, have a passport if they are over 6 months or by December the 31st of the year they are born (whichever is latest). Failure to comply can be punishable by a fine of £5000 or 3 months imprisonment.

A new law (UK only) came into place on 1st July 2009 by which a passport can only be issued to a horse (of any age) if it has been microchipped. Please remind your vet that they must mark the location of the chip with an 'm' in a circle.

PLEASE use this list to check all applications for registration before sending them to the Society.

HAVE YOU ENCLOSED?:

- The Entry Fee
- The covering certificate or Society AI forms – is it valid for the correct stallion and year?
- Photographs of any white markings
- If an overseas horse at least 4 good colour photographs (one of each side, on from the front and one from behind)
- A hair sample for DNA (collected by a vet at the time of completing the ID chart)

HAVE THE FOLLING BEEN COMPLETED?:

- Name, sex, date of birth, breeder's details, owner's details if applicable
- The declaration as to colour/mismatching
- The Breeder's declaration
- The ID chart and signed by a vet and the microchip number and location noted

Incomplete or incorrect applications take up valuable office time and **WILL DELAY THE ISSUE OF A PASSPORT.**
